Description: Explore ethical uses of generative artificial intelligence (AI) in the practice of law. Today's AI serves as a legal assistant, not a lawyer. 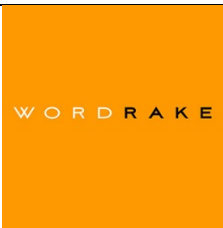
